

Australia had 134 million hectares of forest in 2016, covering 17% of Australia's land area. This is around 3% of the world's forests.

In June 2018, around 8.9 million hectares of native forests and plantations were certified for forest management under either Responsible Wood, Forestry Stewardship Council, or both schemes.
